OFFICE ORDER

Subject:- Regarding facilities to be provided to DGEHS beneficiaries.

This is in continuation to instructions dated 12/05/2008 regarding implementations of Delhi Government Employees Health scheme, following instructions may be brought into the notice of all concerned for smooth implementation of the scheme.

1. Authorized Medical Attendants / Specialists should prescribe Generic drugs which are available in the Dispensary / Hospital, as far as possible, so that immediate availability of drugs to beneficiaries can be ensured. Generic drugs available in Dispensaries / Hospitals having identical formulation / Therapeutic value should be issued to the beneficiaries. DGEHS beneficiaries may be educated that proprietary / branded drugs manufactured by different manufacturers and having same generic composition have same therapeutic value.
2. All medicines, surgical or non surgical items (including implants, consumables and non consumables etc.) required during the course of the treatment of DGEHS beneficiary in outdoor / Indoor should be provided free of cost by the dispensary / Hospital.
3. Separate queue / counter should be available in hospitals / dispensaries for registration and consultations for DGEHS beneficiaries. Similar arrangement should also be available at counters for dispensing of drugs and sample collection.
4. In case of chronic illnesses requiring prolonged treatment the drugs may be dispensed for a period of one month. However, in case of senior Citizens suffering from chronic conditions requiring prolonged treatment, the same may be dispensed up to a period of three months on the decision of the AMA at the attached Dispensary / Hospital.
5. In case drugs prescribed to pensioner beneficiaries are not available at the attached dispensary through the routine indents system from central store at DHS. The dispensary shall get the same indented from nearest linked Government Hospital, till new system of supply of medicines through empanelled chemist is in place. A regular indent for the same should be sent to linked hospital and drugs so received from the hospital should be dispensed to beneficiaries through dispensary.

6. If during emergent conditions / urgency or due to delay during the process of indenting the medicines, the beneficiaries have to procure the drugs from market then non-availability certificate should be issued for such drugs by Authorized Medical Attendant.
